








The proposed location is an unused vacant Front Country Ranger Station located at Hwy 138/ Valley Drive where Crestline and VOE meet.




SLOPED AREAS FOR THERAPY DOG PLAY



AREAS SHOWING SLOPE







FLAT AREAS: CORNER VALLEY/HWY 138






